







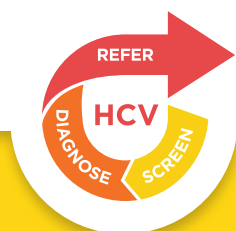


SCREEN RISK FACTORS FOR HCV

Regardless of symptoms, screen patients who have any of these risk factors¹⁻³:

	A birth date between 1945 and 1965
	History of injectable drug use
	HIV infection
	Tattoos from unregulated environments
	Medical conditions such as hemophilia or abnormal liver enzyme levels
	A blood transfusion or organ transplant before July 1992
	Employment in emergency medical services or public safety
	An HCV-positive mother
